



Architect Armando Dominador Nicoleta ALLÍ, fuap, fspac, piep, aaif

Arch. ALLÍ (*pronounced al - YEEH*) is a product of the University of the Philippines (UP) College of Architecture (1982) and of the UP School of Urban and Regional Planning (1994). He has had about **25.0** years of progressively responsible/ diversified experience in the practice of the **architectural** and **allied design** professions, particularly in the fields of **site, physical** and **environmental planning, architectural interiors** and in the **project management of consulting services**.

He is the incumbent **Chair** of the **Professional Regulatory Board of Architecture (PRBoA)** under the PRC. He is also a **DTI-CIAP-CIAC**-accredited professional in the field of **alternative dispute resolution (ADR)** for the construction industry i.e. a **construction arbitrator** and a **construction mediator** and periodically serves as a part-time **technical consultant** to the office of a Philippine Senator.

For the last 15.0 years, Archt. ALLI served as a Partner of **DACY Architects/ Planners Co.** and is also the Principal of **ADNAapec Development Consulting**. He has been a member of the United Architects of the Philippines (**UAP**) for almost 25.0 years, and has served in many chapter, district and national positions until becoming a **UAP District Director** (1990) and a **UAP Fellow** (2002). In 2002, he also became a founding Trustee of the Architecture Advocacy International Foundation (**AAIF**), Inc. an organization that actively took part in the crafting of and in the sustained lobby effort for **R.A. No. 9266** (the **Architecture Act of 2004**) and its **IRR** in full collaboration with the UAP.

Archt. ALLI has co-represented the UAP in the **DPWH** Board of Consultants (**BoC**) from 2002 to date and was instrumental in the extensive revision of the architectural sections of the **2004 Revised IRR** of P.D. No. 1096 (the 1977 National Building Code of the Philippines), which took effect in 2005. As a senior officer and as the 2005 President of the Confederation of Filipino Consulting Organizations (**COFILCO** at www.cofilco.org), he actively lobbied for the recognition and protection of Philippine consultants, particularly for public sector and **ODA**-funded projects under existing procurement laws/ regimes. *Nothing follows.*
